SUBJECT: INTERVIEW WITH BELONNY MICHEL

1. On Monday July 24, 1995 at approximately 2105 hours, Trooper Conley and I had occasion to speak with Belonny Michel DOB: 04-14 Boston Street, Somerville, MA.

2. Mr. Michel told us that on the night of July 23, 1995 his brother and family were visiting him at his residence. At approximately 6:15 to 6:20 PM his brother and family were getting ready to leave. Mr. Michel said that Janet Downing drove up in her car in front of her residence at 71 Boston Street. She stopped in front of her house. She then backed in the driveway, sat idle for approximately five minutes and then pulled back on the street in front of the house again.

3. At this time Mr. Michel thought it was unusual and he pointed out the incident to his brother. He went on to say that at this time Janet Downing parked the car in front of her house. She got out of the car and had what appeared to be a cigarette hanging out of her mouth that was not lit. She opened the trunk. Mr. Michel said the trunk was full of what appeared to be grocery bags. She carried two of the bags into the house.

4. Janet Downing came out of the house and stood in front of her car. Mr. Michel said that she was acting unusual. She stood in front of her car and smoked the entire cigarette that was previously hanging from her mouth. Mr. Michel said that it was as if something had upset her.


