

4:45 P.M. - The Investigator telephoned and spoke with Attorney Maria C. Curtatone, who stated that, after the conclusion of the Edward O'Brien Trial, and on the Monday following the television program "20/20" - which examined the Trial and Verdict - she had received a telephone call from an unidentified male.

The male told her that, "Mike M , who was interviewed on "20/20", is a friend to and works with Paul Downing, Sr., the ex-husband of the Victim, Janet Downing."

The unidentified male further stated that, he was "afraid to come forward." He said that he frequently sees Mike M and Paul Downing, Sr. together, in "the office". He added that his child attends the same school as one of the O'Brien children, Saint Clemens. He said that his has always wanted to give this information to Patricia O'Brien, but he has been too afraid to come forward.

The same male told Attorney Curtatone that Paul Downing, Sr., had on several occasions said that he was still in love with Janet Downing.
